Auszug aus dem Reisetagebuch von Vivien Koch:

Monday, June 3rd, 2019

Dear diary,

Today I woke up at 4.30 am. After breakfast my father drove me to school. The bus left at 5.30 am. On the bus we all played games like Uno and talked a lot. At 3.40 pm we took the ferry from Calais to Dover. We arrived in London at Hyde Park View Hostel at 7 pm. In groups of at least three persons we explored the neighbourhood, bought food and drinks for the night.

Tuesday, June 4th, 2019

Today I woke up at 7 am and made myself ready for the day. We all met at 8.50 am in front of the hostel to go to the museums which we had chosen before the journey. My friends and I visited *Tate Modern*. After that we had 4 hours of free time so we could eat something or go shopping. From 5 to 7 pm we did a treasure hunt about Piccadilly in groups of six. We walked for a long time and answered a lot of questions about famous buildings or parks. We were very tired at the end of the day.

Wednesday, June 5th, 2019

Today we went to *Shakespeare's Globe*, where we were split up into two smaller groups. A guide showed us the Theatre and told us a lot of interesting facts about it. In the afternoon we went to *HMS Belfast*, which is an old ship. My teacher Mrs. Abert, my friends and I explored the ship and took some pictures. At 7 pm we met at Covent Garden and went to Gillian Lynne Theatre where we watched a musical called *School of Rock*. This was so amazing. The actors sang all the time and it was the first time that I watched a musical.

Thursday, June 6th, 2019

Today we walked for one hour to one of the highlights of our trip – the *London Eye*. During the walk we passed *Buckingham Palace*. Afterwards we visited the *London Dungeon*, which is opposite the *London Eye* and so cool! They told us creepy stories about the past and we were scared by the actors working there. Everywhere there were special effects for example fire, wind or thunder. At 6 pm we walked to Tower Bridge and took many photos. The Bridge was so big and there were so many people. Then we arrived at the *Medieval Banquet* to have our farewell dinner. The staff of the restaurant wore costumes. They sang, danced and in-between we had our meal. Instead of applauding we all knocked on the tables with our fists and ended up with a small disco. We could dance till 11.30 pm!

Friday, June 7th, 2019

Today was the last day of our trip. After breakfast we placed our suitcases in a storage room and then we went to museums. After that we had free time to go shopping and have lunch. My friends and I enjoyed the last day until the bus left London at 7.00 pm. London was an amazing time I will never forget.
